Visitor visa (subclass 600) Document Checklist - Vietnam

Important:

- Please lodge your visa application at least four (4) weeks prior to your intended travel date. We recommend that
 you do not enter into any binding financial commitments, such as purchasing airline tickets, before you have been
 notified of the decision on your visa application.
- The application form should be completed and all relevant supporting documentation provided. A decision may be made solely on the information that you provide with your application at time of lodgement and failure to do so might result in visa refusal.
- You do not need to provide a translation for Vietnamese language documents. All other foreign language documents **must** be accompanied by a certified English translation.
- Certified copies must be authorised or stamped as being true copies of the original document by the local authority in Vietnam. In Australia, documents may be certified by a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the Statutory Declarations Act, 1959. Do not send photocopies of certified documents. Biometrics Collection: most clients lodging visa applications in Vietnam, regardless of nationality, need to attend in person to provide their fingerprints and a digital facial photograph as part of visa application processing. The collection of biometrics is conducted at VFS Global in Hanoi, Ho Chi Minh City or Danang. Please take your original passport with you. additional Information required for children under 18 years of age	
the visa applicant is under 18 years of age, and intends on travelling without one or ooth of their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) please provide the following:	
An original letter signed by any non-accompanying parent(s) or legal guardian(s) consenting to the grant of the visa. This letter must clearly state the child's name, name of the consenting parent(s)/guardian(s), and consent for the child to travel to Australia with the person accompanying them certified by the local authorities, <i>or</i> A court order from Australia or Vietnam permitting the removal of the child, <i>and</i> A certified copy of the National Identity Card of the non-accompanying parent or legal guardian	
applying under the Tourist stream:	
Your itinerary for your stay in Australia, <i>or</i> intending to visit a relative, partner or friend in Australia:	
Evidence of the visa applicant's relationship to the person they intend to visit, <i>and</i> A letter of invitation from the person the applicant intends to visit. If your relative, partner or friend is paying for your visit, evidence of their personal funds and income, <i>and</i> A copy of the relative/partner or friend's passport identity page or other evidence of their identification such as a driver's licence	
intending to study for three months or less in Australia: Details of the course you have enrolled in	
applying under the Business Visitor stream:	
A copy of your passport (please do not submit original passports); A letter of invitation from the Australia-based company or organisation; and An original or certified copy of the Third Person Note from the Consular Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Hanoi, or the Department of External Relations in Ho Chi Minh City (or your Embassy/Consulate) showing the reason for your travel as a government official	
All other Passport holders: evidence of why you need to visit Australia on business and the ype(s) of business activity you will undertake while in Australia, <i>including</i> ; A letter of invitation from the host organisation in Australia If you are attending a conference, your conference registration details A letter from your employer stating the reasons for your visit to Australia
